

Reflection

Why, because this is my first step in being an "influencer" to others...LOL

From the readings on Pentecost Sunday from the Book of Acts, we hear about the Apostles speaking to the various people in their native language. What puzzles the people is that they hear them speaking fluently in a language that would be foreign to most Jewish people. Remember in Jesus' time, there would have only been a few people that spoke more than one language. If they did, they would have been very wealthy people who traveled to these lands to do business. How did they do it? Easy, they were filled with the Holy Spirit in the image of tongues of fire! We don't hear what the apostles thought after preaching to these people. What their reaction was to their own miracle. What an impressive example of what Jesus can do in our lives.

So, the question today is, what "miracles" have we done in our lives? Since we are all baptized, the Holy Spirit is inside of us in our hearts. We are also reinforced with "supernatural steroids" (I got this from Fr. John Riccardo – look him up) also known as the Eucharist. If we think about some situations in our lives, it was the grace of God that helped us. It should also inspire us to realize with God's help we can carry out much more/ However, our work that we do should be what God wants us to do and not what we want to do. Our efforts should always bring glory to God!

One of my pet peeves is that we don't hear the words, "thank you" very much these days! I encouraged the students at school to make a real effort in thanking people every day. For example, thank your parents for loving you, putting food on the table and providing a place to sleep; make sure you thank the teachers, administrators, and support people at school for giving you an environment to learn. Who then, do we need to "thank" in our lives? The first person we need to thank is God! Then our spouses (if you're married), family members, friends, co-workers, and list could go on.

Let us go and look for opportunities to "thank" those people who have helped us become the person we are today and continue to inspire us to be the face of Christ to others!

What is an ACTS Retreat?

An ACTS Retreat is a parish-based event which offers parishioners an opportunity to experience the love of Jesus Christ and in turn foster a desire for intentional discipleship. ACTS Retreats are given by parishioners for parishioners, with support of parish clergy, and in this way, serve to build Christian community within the parish.

ACTS is an acronym based on the activities and fruits of the retreat.

Adoration – Responding through prayer and worship to receiving God's gifts of grace, mercy, and love.

Community - Participating in the One Body of Christ as Church.

Theology - Deepening our relationship with God in order to better understand and fulfill His will for our lives.

Service - Answering the call to discipleship by following the model Christ gave us.

The Retreat Experience:

While utilizing prayer, service, and teaching, the ACTS Retreat meets people where they are in their spiritual journey and invites them to experience God in a manner that is both personal and communal. In this way, the ACTS Retreat fulfills the mission of "Spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ among Catholic Communities through ACTS."

It's a Spiritual Reflection & Spiritual Surrender:

The ACTS Retreat experience is rooted in the Pascal Mystery in that retreatants are invited to reflect on the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Throughout the weekend, they are invited to prayerfully consider how they can respond to His love by spiritually surrendering to Jesus in order to have new life with Him.


