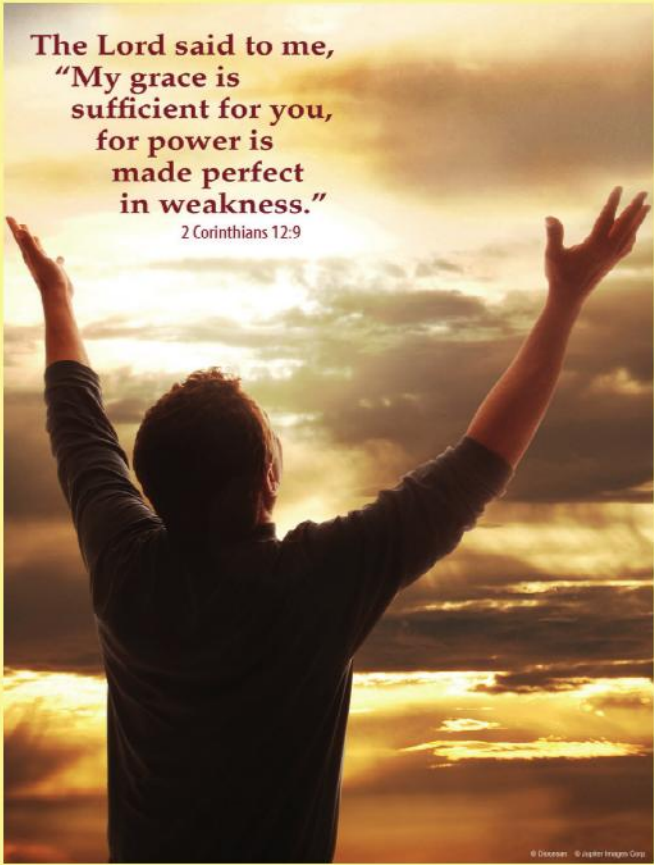

Reflection

Question of the day.... Have you ever heard the phrase, "rain rain go away come back another day" well...someone is listening! We celebrate every July 4th as Independence Day. If our forefathers could return, I wonder what they would think? I'm sure they would be amazed at all of the electronic stuff and of course our various modes of transportation. I would like to ask them if they ever imagined a country so advanced in some areas and still weak in others. What would you ask them? These comments lead me, hopefully you too, to the readings of the 14th week in Ordinary Time.

Growing up my dad was the "John Wayne" type, John Wayne was the first macho man before we called men, "macho man" (What?). These guys were tough as nails. No, not that kind you get painted every other week, but the ones that used to build things. My dad, like so many other men, would just tough it out when they were hurting. I can only remember once or twice when he would go to the doctor or even take aspirin.

Many times, we tend to not hear much about the second reading on Sundays. Usually, it is because the message from this reading does not tie into the theme of my homily. So today, I would like to focus on Paul's letter to the Corinthians. Why, because he speaks about our weaknesses! In the 2nd reading, Paul gladly boasts of his weaknesses. Why, because when he is weak, he is strong because Christ is in him. Unfortunately, some people in this world don't like to admit their weaknesses. Why? We are all human. We are Imperfect. Some of us share the same Weaknesses, while other peoples seem to have more than others. I don't like to give advice but, on this topic, I think it is important to remember one thing. We only grow from our weaknesses! What? Yes, that's right! You heard it here, hopefully, not for the first time.

One of my favorite songs is Blessings by Laura Story. I highly recommend listening to it, especially when you are feeling weak. Some of the lines are "what if my greatest disappointments, or the aching of this life, is the revealing of a greater thirst that this world can't satisfy. What if the trials of this life, the rain, the storms, the hardest nights, are your mercies in disguise?"

If we look back at our lives and try to think of when we overcame something difficult, we may be amazed at our strength and resolve. What is most

important is to realize Christ was with us every step of the way. Therefore, as Paul tells us, "I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and constraints, for the sake of Christ; for when I am weak, then I am strong."
